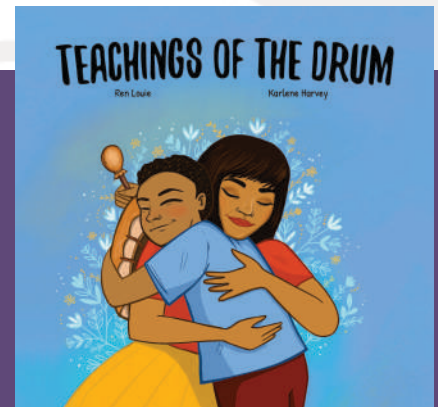

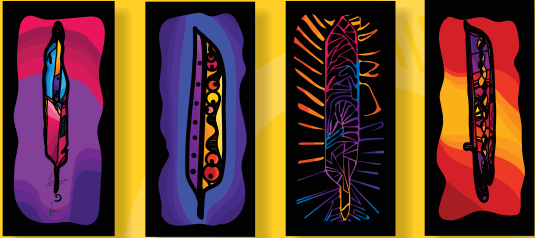

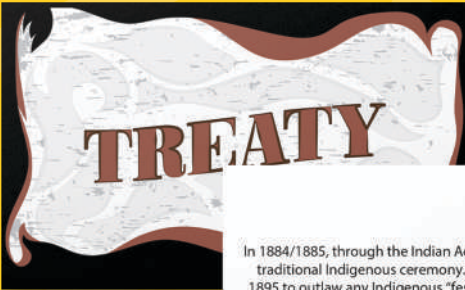

The Sixties Scoop
From 1951 to 1984, approximately 20,000 or more Indigenous children were forcibly removed from their families.^{1,2} Of these children, an estimated 70% were adopted out to non-Indigenous people.³
Indigenous participants lose 2 Language, 2 Culture, and 2 Identity cards.



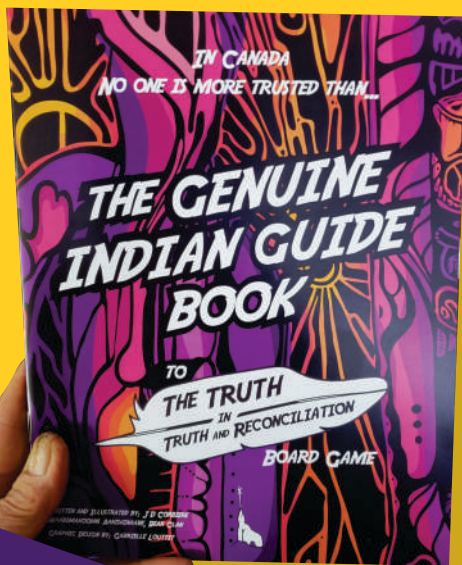
In 1884/1885, through the Indian Act, Canada banned the Potlatch, a traditional Indigenous ceremony. This ban was then amended in 1895 to outlaw any Indigenous "festival, dance or other ceremony." A further amendment in 1925 prohibited dancing completely.²²
Indigenous participants lose 2 Language, 2 Culture, and 2 Identity cards.
